The <u>Michigan Leadership Institute</u> is registering participants for the 2017 SUPES Academy — the Superintendent Preparation Series Academy. SUPES is a comprehensive leadership development experience that prepares individuals who will be the next "class" of superintendent candidates—those considering the pursuit of positions in the year 2017 or thereafter.

Searching "Michigan Leadership Institute" as a major and original subcontractor for one of at least two Eli Broad-run (initially) "BroadCenter.org" related nonprofits funded by the Broad Foundation.

Target participants are people with the potential to be outstanding educational leaders who are considering applying for their first superintendency during the coming year or thereafter. The Academy will accommodate up to 45 participants. Participants must commit to attending every class session and completing assignments between

classes.
