I found a separate corporate ID# for the AISR on State of Rhode Island, classification Domestic Nonprofit, but no corresponding EIN# to it and it only shows up. (incl. under IRS Exempt Org. Select Check for R.I.). It may be considered exempt from filing somehow, but as of this donation, it's going directly to the University. Brown calls the AISR also the largest of its "Centers, Programs, and Institutes" while also an "organization." No identity and No tax returns for the AISR purpose is a significant problem. Look at the purpose (Providence C&Y Cabinet is for public purposes).

Its Total Gross assets are major (about \$0.75Billion) some (see other parts of this same return) in bank accounts in: Cayman Islands, Ireland, and Curacao. (That's nothing compared to how much \$4B+Brown U holds in other countries, more countries, and a high percentage of (the above EIN# nonprofit representing Brown U — not including its separate research foundation) them also.
